Draft Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held at 3 Roeburn Drive, Grosvenor Park on Friday 24th May 2019 at 7-00 pm.

1992 Apologies: Apologies were received from Councillors Mrs M Baxter and Mr S Edmondson

1993 Minutes: Subject to a minor amendment, it was **RESOLVED** that the Minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 24th April March 2019 be approved.

1994 Declarations on interest: There were no declarations of interest

1995 Public discussion and information only updates:

- 1. **Public Discussion**: No members of the public were present
- Clerk's Report & correspondence: The clerk reported on correspondence received and previously circulated, highlighting the notice of the uncontested local election and the receipt of the annual precept. It was then RESOLVED that the Clerk's Report be noted.
- 3. **Members matters & information only updates**: It was reported that there had been a recent car accident outside the school and that vehicles continue to be parked on the pavement on Roeburn Drive, particularly at the start and end of school and during school events.

After some discussion about the ongoing problems with driver behaviour on Roeburn Drive in relation to Grosvenor Park School, it was **RESOLV ED** that Members matters, and updates be noted.

Members considered the above planning application and it was **RESOLVED** that no representations be made.

1997 Planning Application decisions: Members considered decisions made by Lancaster City Council's Planning Committee in recent weeks.

It was then **RESOLVED** that it be noted that decisions were awaited on all four applications recently considered by the parish council.

The Clerk reported that he had contacted LALC regarding the increase in the annual subscription and had been advised that this was because the annual subsidy that parish and town councils used to receive was no longer available. There was a further discussion about the cost of the subscription and services provided by LALC.

It was then **RESOLVED** that payments be approved and that a paper be produced for consideration by Members on the benefits received from LALC as part of the annual subscription.

1999 Change of bank: The Clerk presented Members with forms to enable the transfer of the current bank account to Unity Trust Bank. Three signatories to the account need to be agreed, forms signed, and supplementary documents sent to Unity Trust including copies of the last six months statements, standing orders and recent meeting Minutes.

It was **RESOLVED** that the authorised signatories to the new bank account be Cllrs Kelly, Melling and Edmondson be authorised signatories and that the signed forms and supplementary documentation be forwarded to Unity Trust giving authorisation for the transfer to be carried out.

1980 Parish Plan: Councillor Percy reported on the recent examination of the Lancaster District Local Plan by the Planning Inspector and a series of hearings undertaken as part of the process. Members were advised that having heard representations over the scheduled four days of the hearings he had authorised an additional day to consider matters concerning housing needs assessment and a 5-year housing land supply.

Over the five days the potential for several 'main modifications' to the draft local plan which Lancaster City Council must now address and consult upon. After this has been completed the Planning Inspector will produce a final report on the soundness and legal compliance of the Local Plan.

Councillor Percy then raised matters relating to the Parish Plan, specifically relating to identifying and understanding the needs of vulnerable residents and the wider views of the local community about the parish and local services. It was noted that Thurnham with Glasson Parish Council are currently producing a Residents Survey and it was suggested that this may be a useful starting point for considering something similar for Heaton with Oxcliffe.

Fixed Penalty Scheme in operation. Maximum fine £1,000

In relation to the parish outcome for improving roads and pavements it was highlighted that Lancaster City Council are currently running a campaign on the issue of dog fouling. The campaign outlines that under the Anti-social Behaviour and Policing Act, it is an offence not to clean up after a dog has defecated on public land, carrying an £80 fixed penalty fine or prosecution through the magistrates court, where the maximum fine us £1,000.

It was suggested that the Parish Council supports this campaign through social media and posters being displayed in the parish noticeboards.

After some discussion, it was **RESOLVED** that over the coming months the Parish Council drafts a Residents Survey for distribution and that the parish council supports Lancaster City Council's campaign on the issue of dog fouling and promotes this through social media and parish noticeboards. **ACTION:** The Parish Clerk was asked to research the cost of specific dog waste bins with a view to these being located around the parish.
